Innsbruck: Austria's paradise in the alps ideal for summer and winter holidays

It is always a pleasure to visit Austria as I consider it one of the best tourism destination in the world for many reasons: the nice, friendly people, fresh air, magnificent heritage and civilization, food and everything a tourist could wish for.

European cities and the best facilities for winter tourism and skiing.

There are plenty of ski schools and the locals provide excellent services and share their cars and experience with tourists.





In the program of our visit, we had the chance to reach the highest mountains in Innsbruck by using the very advanced cable carriage; you can enjoy the view, and have a tea and coffee in the restaurants and cafes.

We also visited the Swarovski show room, considered to be the second most visited place in Austria, with the biggest crystal - a 300,000 carat.

We were also very fortunate to see a unique carnival where all the citizens dress up in strange costumes and masks and dance and sing to welcome the snow and the tourists. They also thank God for their beautiful city.

We stayed in the four-star Sport Hotel, with a wonderful view of the Alps, and were served traditional food. The hotel also had a swimming pool and a spa. The Schiloss five-star hotel nearby, managed by the same family, had a very rich history. There is no room in Innsbruck for the major hotel chains and almost all the old buildings have been renovated and turned into hotels.

Innsbruck is one of the world's top summer and winter tourist destinations combining the splendor of the alps with fresh air, magnificent scenery, a rich cultural heritage and sports for all tastes and ages.
